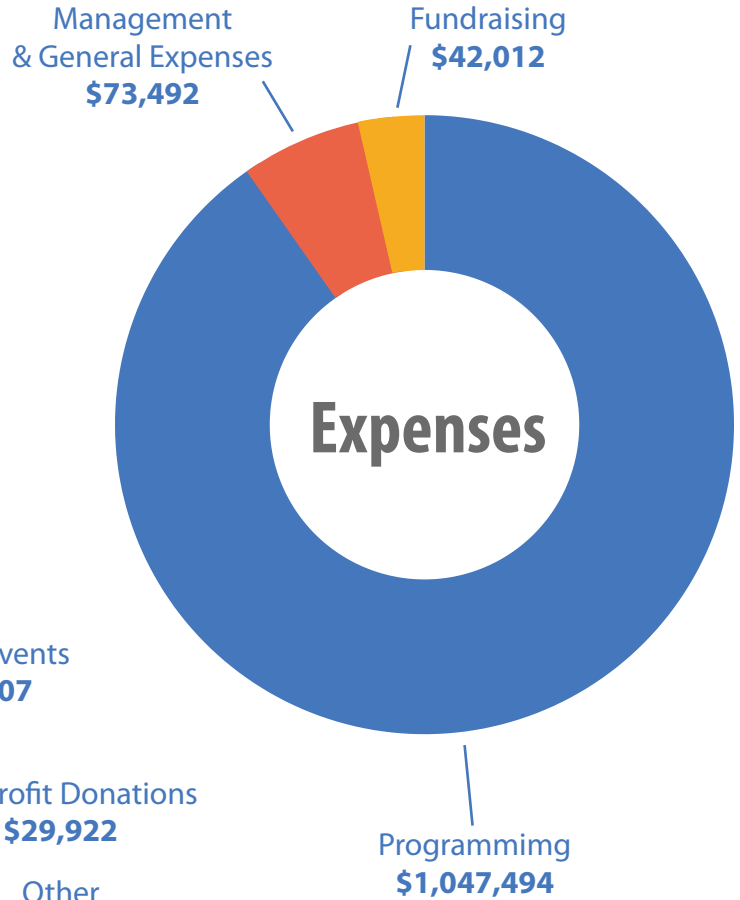
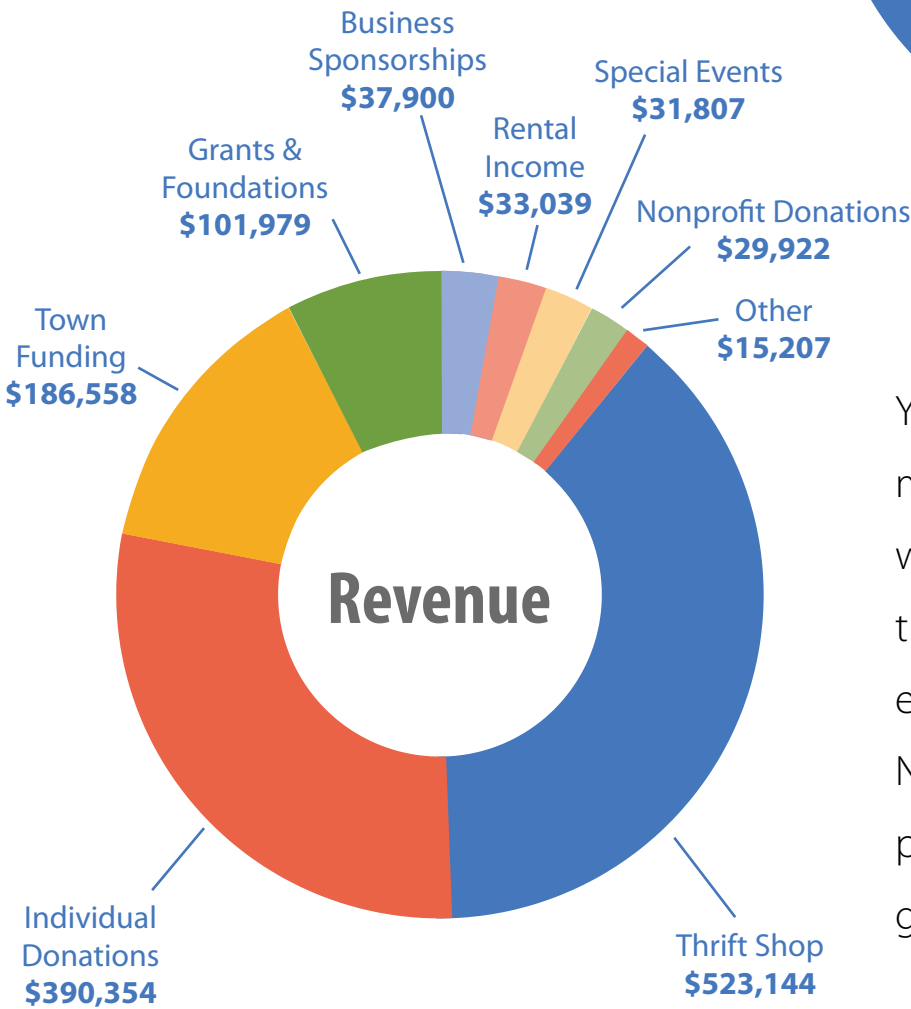

FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 SERVICES STATISTICS

Food Pantry

- Nearly 180 households, or 335 people per month accessed the Food Pantry.
- 90 tons of food donations came from Good Shepherd Food Bank, grocery stores, businesses and the public.

Free Community Lunch

- An average of 60 meals and 25 deliveries provided twice per month.

BackPack Program

- 68 children received food weekly through the school year.

Summer Camp Scholarships 2022

- 30 Freeport & Pownal children received scholarships.

Age Friendly Enrichment

- Social, wellness, educational and enrichment activities attended by more than 100 people monthly.

Emergency Assistance

- \$2,000 granted to 16 households for electricity, eyeglasses, auto repair, dental and more.
- 51 individuals received \$2,315 in Salvation Army gas vouchers.



Volunteers

- FCS averaged 940 volunteer service hours per month, with approximately 110 active volunteers, the equivalent of about 6 full-time employees.

General Assistance

- 235 individuals provided with over \$228,000 of food, shelter, housing and other assistance.

Kaplan Fuel Fund

- 85 households, or 198 individuals, provided with fuel assistance.

Thanksgiving and Holiday Helpline

- 78 households received Thanksgiving food boxes, and 150 people were served a Thanksgiving meal.
- 167 households, or 524 individuals received holiday gifts.

Thrift Shop

- 80 households were provided gift cards to purchase goods worth nearly \$2,000.

Medical Equipment Loans

- 88 people borrowed 158 pieces of medical equipment.
